Subject: Surplus Property Declaration

The police department is requesting permission to have a 1984 Chevrolet Step-Side Van, City ID number 42-17 bearing VIN: 1GCFP22J5E337924, which is currently assigned to the police department declared surplus property so that we may proceed with selling the vehicle through Purple Wave, Inc. surplus online auction service.

The police department received this vehicle at no cost to the City in October of 1999 as part of the military surplus reallocation program. Since receiving the vehicle, it has been used for a number of purposes within the police department to include use as a special response team deployment vehicle and to transport equipment for various purposes. Unfortunately, the vehicle has reached the end of its useful life and has not been operational for some time. Due to military configurations related to the electrical system, the cost to repair the vehicle far exceeds its actual value.

We have confirmed with the military that they have no vested interest in the return of the vehicle for military use, and have been authorized to dispose of the vehicle through whatever means we deem appropriate. Therefore, we are respectfully requesting City Commission approval to declare the vehicle as surplus property so that it may be disposed of through auction as previously noted. CDL loan forgiveness

On January 23, 2013, the City of Pittsburg entered into a \$150,000 forgivable loan agreement with CDL Electric Company, Inc., to help fund the acquisition and renovation of the former McNally Industries facility at 1308 North Walnut. This project enabled CDL to expand its operations and helped filled a building that had largely been vacant for more than 20 years.

The City's contract with CDL stated that the company would be eligible to have its annual payments forgiven each year provided that CDL invested at least \$273,000 of its own funds in the project and employed at least 50 employees at the former McNally Industries building over the life of the loan (through 2018).

As the third repayment on the loan is due, CDL submitted verification that the company had invested well over the required \$273,000 and, as of January 1, 2017, employed 135 at the former McNally Industries building. The EDAC reviewed this information at its February 1 meeting and concluded that CDL had satisfied the requirements to have its 2017 loan payment in the amount of \$41,564.68 forgiven. The EDAC has recommended forgiveness for this year's loan installment.

Mr. Wilson is constructing a new single family residence on this property and is requesting approval of a private sewage disposal system since the City's wastewater collection system is not readily available for connection to this property (see attached map).

Upon review of this request, the Public Utilities Department is recommending approval of Mr. Wilson's request for a private sewage disposal system based on Section 82-243, Private Sewage Disposal within the City, of the City Codes, which states:

The installation of septic tanks or similar means of disposal within the City limits shall only be authorized by the expressed approval of the Governing Body. The type, capacities, location, and layout of a private sewage disposal system shall comply with all requirements of the State Department of Health and Environment and the Uniform Plumbing Code.

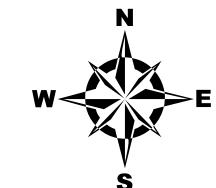

Pointe Royale project

The Pittsburg Department of Housing and Community Development has been working closely with Pointe Royale Development, Inc. to develop a 20-house development off 31st Street. Pointe Royale planned to use Low Income Housing tax credits to finance part of the project, but due to recent national developments, the value of those credits has dropped significantly. This \$373,000 loss in equity has created a gap in financing.

On February 1, 2017, the Economic Development Advisory Committee (EDAC) considered a \$300,000 repayable loan request from Tom Carlson, President/CEO of Pointe Royale Development, Inc. to help offset this drop in value. These funds would match the investment made by Pointe Royale Development and would not be disbursed until the homes are built. Further, the City will take a first mortgage on the homes until the loan is repaid over a 15-year period. This arrangement is similar to Pointe Royale's partnership with other Southeast Kansas communities, including the Cities of Independence, Coffeyville and Iola.

Please place this item on the agenda for the City Commission meeting scheduled for Tuesday, February 14, 2017. Action being requested is approval or denial of the EDAC recommendation and, if approved, authorize the Mayor to sign the appropriate documents.

REQUEST FOR \$300,000 CITY LOAN

Reason for Request

With the new administration in Washington, corporate taxes are in question. Both President Trump and the Congress are talking about lowering corporate taxes. If corporate taxes are lower, that means the demand for federal tax credits will be lower right as well.

Last year when we submitted our application to the Kansas Housing Resource Commission (KHRC), the market for Low Income Housing Tax Credits was 94 cents on the dollar. Until the election, pricing was as high as \$1.04 in some markets. Now it is 81 cents to 85 cents because of the uncertainty surrounding the changes to the Tax Code. No one knows what is going to happen.

Last year we hoped to build 29 units in Pittsburg, nine on Rouse Street and 20 off 31st street. Because the 31st Street location is in a qualified census tract, it is eligible for up to 30 per cent more tax credits than the Rouse location. (The tax credits are sold to corporate income taxpayers and the proceeds are used to build the housing.)

With the big drop in pricing the Rouse location cannot be financed without the 30% boost that is available on the Rouse location.

As to the 31st Street location, the drop in pricing still means that there is \$373,000 less equity to construct the 20 houses.

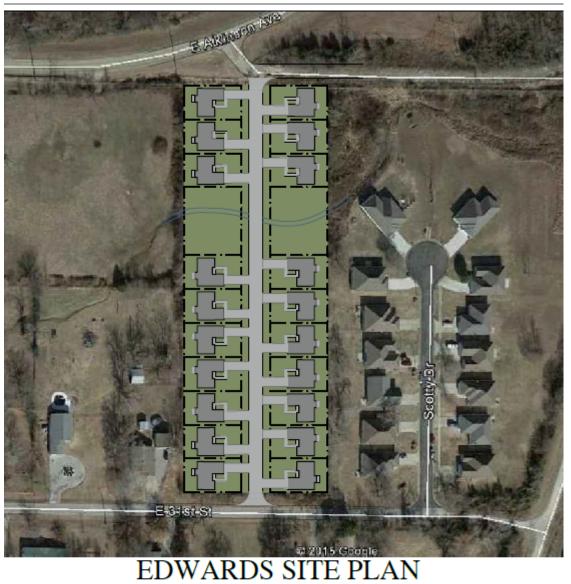
I am asking the City to make a loan for \$300,000 to fill the gap that has been caused by the current uncertainty around the Tax Code.

Justification for Request

I think this is a reasonable request for the following reasons:

- 1. I will be matching the city loan dollar for dollar with my own money by making a similar loan on the property.
- 2. I will agree in advance that if the pricing changes between the time when I am filing this application and the award, that I will reduce my loan request. For example, if I can get another \$100,000 for the credits, then the city and I as the developer will share equally so that we are both putting in \$50,000 less into the project.
- 3. There are less funds to build affordable housing with the drop in pricing so KHRC is going to favor projects in which the community is helping to fund projects in their community.
- 4. These homes will provide much needed affordable housing in the community. "Development follows rooftops." The rents will be very affordable for nice homes, and the occupants will have the right to buy them eventually for less than their fair market value.
- 5. I am not asking the City to put the money in until construction is completed, so there will be no risk. Furthermore, the City will have a first mortgage on these houses so the loan will be very secure, with my mortgage being a second.

- 6. I am not asking for something that is unusual. I have built about 100 houses like this in Kansas in the last five years, and low interest loans in the range of \$200,000 \$300,000 have been made by the cities of Independence, Coffeyville and Iola. All of them would you tell you that they think it is a good value.
- 7. Finally, these properties are not producing income for the taxing authorities at this point. If the development happens, they will eventually be paying much higher taxes into the community.

Farmers Market

The City of Pittsburg is considering assuming the operational responsibilities for Pittsburg Farmers Market. In conjunction with Watco and other entities the City has approved leases and made infrastructure improvements to the area to support the Farmers Market as we believe it is vital to the citizens of Pittsburg and the success of the farmers in our area.

In the past the Market was operated by a board of directors and has had difficulty covering their operating expenses. Since being approached in November by members of the Board, City staff members have been in communications with attorneys, the USDA, organizers of the Double Up Bucks Program, vendors and other interested organizations. City staff members believe that the operations of the market should be under the Parks and Recreation Department where market operations and individual facility rentals can be managed.

The City of Pittsburg anticipates forming a seven (7) person advisory board to oversee the policies and procedures of the market. Additionally, the City will hire a part time employee to oversee the operations of the market. Aside from the City funding the position through the market season, the City is also currently working with the County, through Live Well Crawford County, to utilize the same position for consulting work with their Healthy Eating and Rural Opportunities (HERO) grant. City staff is also working on partnering with K-State Research and Extension to utilize the position for their work in the High Tunnel at the Southeast Kansas Career and Technical Education Center (Ctec). K-State Extension just received a USDA Food Insecurity Nutrition Grant and labor is budgeted within this grant for work with High Tunnel. We feel that bringing these partnering organizations together, along with appointing a strong advisory board, we can operate a successful Farmers Market in Pittsburg.

Farmers Market Memo Page Two February 8th, 2017

On February 19, 2014 the Farmers Market entered into a promissory note with the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) to build the current Farmers Market structure. This note is at a rate of 4.25 percent per annum for thirty (30) years. The Farmers Market is current on this note, however the City cannot carry such a note on our books so we will need to pay it off in order to assume responsibility for the Market. The City will assume a pay-off balance on the note, not to exceed \$104,632.79. Staff is continuing to work with USDA to have a portion of the loan forgiven. We would like to move forward with this approval, so we can meet the targeted Farmers Markets opening date of April 1st.

On February 1, 2017, the Economic Development Advisory Committee (EDAC) agreed that a vibrant Farmers Market is important to our community and has recommended utilizing Revolving Loan Fund dollars to pay off the remainder of the loan with the USDA. Additionally, proceeds from the recent sale of City owned property may be used to acquire the Farmers Market property. Regardless of the funding source, we believe this recently upgraded community asset is ready to become a significant destination for residents and visitors to our community.

Please place this item on the agenda for the City Commission meeting scheduled for Tuesday, February 14, 2017. Action being requested is approval or disapproval of Staff recommendation to assume operational responsibilities of the Farmers Market.

ORDINANCE NO. G-1266

AN ORDINANCE, creating Article I in Chapter 58 of the Pittsburg City Code for the purpose of creating the Pittsburg Area Farmers Market Advisory Board, describing the Board's authority and duties, and providing for the appointment of members thereof.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF PITTSBURG, KANSAS:

<u>SECTION 1</u>. Article I in Chapter 58 of the Pittsburg City Code is hereby created as follows:

Article I. PITTSBURG AREA FARMERS MARKET ADVISORY BOARD.

Sec. 58.1. Creation; membership. There is hereby created a Pittsburg Area Farmers Market Advisory Board ("Board") for the City of Pittsburg, Kansas. The board shall consist of seven (7) members who shall serve without compensation. The members shall be appointed by the Governing Body; four (4) of whom shall be appointed for a term of three (3) years and three (3) of whom shall be appointed for a term of two (2) years. Following the expiration of the term of the three (3) members appointed for two (2) years, all appointees to the Board shall be appointed for three (3) year terms. No appointee to the Board shall be eligible for re-appointment after serving two (2) consecutive terms on the Board.

Sec. 58.2. Member Qualifications. Three (3) appointees to the Board shall be current dues paying vendors at the Pittsburg Area Farmers Market; one (1) appointee shall be a member of Eat Well/Live Well Crawford County or a similar organization; one (1) appointee shall be a current member of the Growing Growers program at the Southeast Kansas Career and Technical Education Center of Crawford County, LLC; one (1) appointee shall be a member of the Downtown Advisory Board; and one (1) appointee shall be a current employee of the Kansas State Research and Extension office (Wildcat Extension District). Preference may be given to applicants residing in the City of Pittsburg. Appointees shall be drawn from diverse segments of the public, and shall be selected for their wisdom, broad perspective, and ability to assist in planning and development of the Pittsburg Area Farmers Market.

Sec. 58.3. Quorum; action. A majority of the Board shall constitute a quorum. A majority affirmation vote of a quorum shall be necessary for any action taken by the Board.

Sec. 58.4. Officers. The Board at its organizational meeting, and each annual meeting thereafter, shall elect from its membership a chairperson and a vice-

chairperson. The chairperson and vice-chairperson shall have and perform such duties as are commonly associated with respective titles and shall serve for one (1) year and until successors are appointed. The Director of Parks and Recreation shall appoint a secretary for the Board, which person shall be an employee of the City of Pittsburg, and who shall not be entitled to vote on any matter considered by the Board.

Sec. 58.5. Filling of vacancies; removal. Should any member of the Board resign, or be removed by the Governing Body after missing three (3) consecutive regular meetings, the Governing Body shall appoint some other qualified individual to serve the former member's unexpired term.

Sec. 58.6. Meetings; public records. The Board shall have regular monthly meetings to be established by the majority vote of the Board. Special meetings shall be called by the chairperson, vice-chairperson, or upon request of a majority of the members of the Board. Such calls for special meetings and notices shall be given at least forty-eight (48) hours before the time of the meeting so called. The request shall be read and entered into the minutes of such special meeting and no business shall be transacted except that stated in the call for special meeting. The Board shall keep minutes of its meeting and records of its proceedings and other official actions, all of which shall be promptly filed with the City Clerk and shall be public records.

Sec. 58.7. Open meetings; public participation. All meetings of the Board shall be open to the public, with copies of the Agenda available to all interested persons, the City Clerk, and the media at least forty-eight (48) hours in advance of the meeting. It is the intent of the Board to encourage and promote public participation at all meetings of the Board.

Sec. 58.8. Reports; recommendations. The Governing Body shall refer to the Board all major proposals and propositions relating to the operation of the Pittsburg Area Farmers Market. The Board shall make reports and recommendations to the Governing Body on all matters referred to it within the time fixed by the Governing Body. The Board further shall review all existing and future Pittsburg Area Farmer Market facilities, projects and programs.

Design Engineering for the Concrete Overlay on the South Leg of

Highway 69 (Bypass) and 20th Street Intersection

The concrete overlay on Highway 69 (Bypass) at 20th Street is at the end of its useful life. The City of Pittsburg is responsible for the maintenance of the concrete overlay from the center of the Bypass and 20th Street to 680+/- feet south. KDOT has done some soil investigation on the north leg of the intersection and believe that an underdrainage system may be warranted as part of the improvements. The scope of the project would include the determination of the need of an underdrainage system on the City's portion of the roadway.

After discussions with the on-call engineering firms regarding the scope of the design, City staff recommends using TranSystems to design the project and create the bid package for the improvements. TranSystems has provided a not to exceed amount of \$66,400.

Project Understanding

Our understanding of the project, and our approach below is based on information in the RFP, discussions with City Staff, and reviews of the project site. This provides a summary of the key issues and briefly describes our approach to the overall design efforts we believe necessary to provide you with a cost-efficient, timely, and quality project.

The objective of this project is to remove the existing 3" concrete overlay constructed in the early 2000's, plus additional pavement depth necessary for replacement with new concrete pavement. The project limits extend from the center of the intersection to the southern end of the concrete, a distance of approximately 680 feet. In addition, the improvements need to address possible drainage issues to prevent future pavement failures from occurring. The City is responsible for this portion of 69 highway, locally known as the bypass. The



dividing point of ownership between the City and KDOT is at the 20th Street intersection, with the Northern leg the responsibility of KDOT and the southern leg the responsibility of the City. In 2014, discussions between the City and State regarding the replacement of the pavement concluded the best fix for the intersection is to remove the three inch (3") concrete overlay, mill an additional three inches (3") of asphalt and replace with a new six inch (6") concrete overlay. Preliminary geological investigations also recommend a drainage system for the roadway. Since the investigation was conducted several years ago, a review of the existing geological recommendations and determination of the best replacement method is requested. The improvements will be designed and constructed to KDOT standards.

Project Approach

TranSystems has performed numerous roadway and intersection designs across the State of Kansas, including current municipal highway projects in Independence, Coffeyville, Parsons, Baxter Springs and Wellington, as well as design of 69 Highway between Pittsburg and Fort Scott directly for KDOT. It is very important that we develop a clear understanding of the deficiencies of the current system and provide a long-lasting durable design. TranSystems suggests the following approach based on our understanding of the project:

- Review the recommended pavement design proposed in 2014.
- Review the need for a drainage system on the project as proposed in the KDOT soils investigation and geotechnical recommendations.

- ▶ Conduct a new subsurface geological investigation to determine the current conditions of the project. The investigation will include borings at the intersection, southern end of the project and an area where the pavement is currently failing.
- Prepare a final pavement and drainage recommendation and review with the City prior to moving forward with design plans. The team will work with the City to insure the final project plan is the best solution. We feel this method will result in the best choice for improvements and will help all parties involved feel comfortable that the recommendations are based on latest conditions and clearly define professional liability.
- Provide topographical survey necessary of the south half of the intersection and south leg US-69 coming into the intersection. All utilities will be located using the Kansas "One Call" Locate system. New pavement is not anticipated to interfere with utilities, however utility conflicts with the proposed drainage system must be determined. The resulting markings will be surveyed at the same time as the topographic survey.
- Field Check plans will be approximately 50% complete plans and include a detailed cost estimate.
- Once the Field Check Plans are approved, Final Check plans will be prepared, submitted and included a detailed cost estimate. These plans will be approximately 95% complete plans.
- Final Plans for Letting and probable construction cost estimate based on the plan quantities.
- Prepare a bid package and specs for improvements to meet KDOT standards and requirements.

Our staff discussed utilizing the previous geotechnical work completed by KDOT prior to 2014 at length. There are a number of advantages, and disadvantages to utilizing this information. The main advantage is cost savings, while the main disadvantage is unclear professional liability should a problem occur. We would certainly be open to discussing this further with the City, but it is our opinion that the cost savings would not justify the liability issue that is created. TranSystems would recommend the City do a Discovery Phase to determine the best solution for the project prior to completing construction design plans. The Discovery Phase would include:

- Review the recommended pavement design proposed in 2014 to determine if it is adequate.
- Review the need for a drainage system on the project as proposed in the KDOT soils investigation and geotechnical recommendations.
- We will conduct a new subsurface geological investigation to determine the current conditions of the project for use in preparing the final pavement and drainage recommendation.
- Prepare a probable construction cost estimate for the proposed roadway improvements.
