A Regular Session of the Board of Commissioners was held at 5:30 p.m. on Tuesday, February 28th, 2017, in the City Commission Room, located in the Law Enforcement Center, 201 North Pine, with Mayor John Ketterman presiding and the following members present: Michael Gray, Jeremy Johnson, Chuck Munsell, and Patrick O'Bryan.

Pat Nixon, of the First Christian Church, provided the invocation.

Mayor Ketterman led the flag salute.

PUBLIC INPUT - INTERNATIONAL STUDENT INTRODUCTION - Chamber of Commerce Director Blake Benson introduced Humas Tahir, an international student from Pakistan.

PUBLIC INPUT - FARMERS MARKET -

Brad Snow of Watco, the All Aboard Foundation, and a member of the Downtown Advisory Board, encouraged members of the City Commission to assume control of the Farmers Market and the pavilion.

Leah Posterik, co-owner of Signet Coffee (206 South Broadway), and a member of the Downtown Advisory Board, spoke in favor of the City assuming control of the Farmers Market.

Martha Murphy, an employee of the K State Research and Extension Office, and a member of Live Well Crawford County and Eat Well Crawford County, spoke in favor of the City assuming control of the Farmers Market. Ms. Murphy indicated that Eat Well Crawford County has funds available to compensate an employee for operating the Farmers Market.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES – FEBRUARY 14, 2017 - On motion of Gray, seconded by Munsell, the Governing Body approved the February 14, 2017, City Commission Meeting minutes as submitted. Motion carried.

2016 SANITARY SEWER REHAB PROJECT – On motion of Gray, seconded by Munsell, the Governing Body approved staff's request to add additional work to the scope of the project for the 2016 Sanitary Sewer Rehab Project (Hobson Addition, 400 Block N Broadway and Basin 7B) at a cost of \$70,356.00, making a new project total of \$299,994.50. Motion carried.

TEMPORARY DANCE HALL LICENSE – MCCARTHY'S PUB – On motion of Gray, seconded by Munsell, the Governing Body approved the application submitted by Bryan Hanson for a one day Dance Hall License for McCarthy's Pub, located at 221 East 3rd Street, on March 11th, 2017, and authorized the City Clerk to issue the license. Motion carried.

APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE – On motion of Gray, seconded by Munsell, the Governing Body approved the Appropriation Ordinance for the period ending February 28th, 2017, subject to the release of HUD expenditures when funds are received with the following roll call vote: Yea: Gray, Johnson, Ketterman, Munsell, and O'Bryan. Motion carried.

SPECIAL PRESENTATION – FIBER OPTIC INFRASTRUCTURE – This Special Presentation was tabled and will be provided at a future Commission Meeting.

RESOLUTION NO. 1195 – On motion of Gray, seconded by Johnson, the Governing Body approved Resolution No. 1195, supporting the Low Income Housing Tax Credit application to the Kansas Housing Resources Corporation to be submitted by Pointe Royale Development, Inc., for the construction of twenty new homes, and authorized the Mayor to sign the Resolution on behalf of the City. Motion carried.

FARMERS MARKET – On motion of O'Bryan, seconded by Gray, the Governing Body granted staff authorization to assume operational responsibilities of the Farmers Market and authorized the Mayor to sign the appropriate documents on behalf of the City. Motion carried with Ketterman and Munsell voting in opposition.

Ed Cook indicated that when he was affiliated with the Farmers Market in 2014, the Farmers Market was paying all of their bills and had money in the bank.

The Governing Body directed the City Manager to negotiate the grant payoff amount with the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) and return to a later City Commission Meeting for Governing Body approval of the funding and repayment options available to the City.

ORDINANCE NO. G-1266 – On motion of Gray, seconded by Johnson, the Governing Body approved Ordinance No. G-1266, creating Article 1 in Chapter 58 of the Pittsburg City Code for the purpose of creating the Pittsburg Area Farmers Market Advisory Board, describing the Board's authority and duties, and providing for the appointment of members thereof, and authorized the Mayor to sign the Ordinance on behalf of the City. Motion carried with Munsell voting in opposition.

4th STREET OVERPASS PROJECT RIGHT-OF-WAY ACQUISITION – On motion of Gray, seconded by Munsell, the Governing Body approved the recommendation of the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) to use a small portion of Schlanger Park as part of the right-of-way acquisition for the 4th Street Overpass Project (Project No. 126-19 KA-3103-01), and authorized the Mayor to sign the appropriate documents on behalf of the City. Motion carried.

NON-AGENDA REPORTS & REQUESTS:

ESRI AGREEMENT – On motion of Gray, seconded by O'Bryan, the Governing Body approved staff recommendation to enter into a three-year agreement with Environmental Systems Research Institute, Inc. (ESRI) for the purchase of GIS Software Licensing in the amount of \$27,650 per year. Motion carried.

Pittsburg Community Tennis Complex MOU

City Staff is requesting that the City of Pittsburg enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with USD 250 regarding the responsibilities of the Pittsburg Community Tennis Complex, located west of Pittsburg High School at 1978 E. 4th Street.

The MOU details that USD 250 will be responsible for utilities and maintenance at the complex and that we will have policies and procedures regarding the usage of the complex. This MOU serves as final documentation needed to complete the requirements for project reimbursement to USD 250 from the Land and Water Conservation Fund, which granted funding for the build in order for the complex grounds to be deemed park land.

In this regard would you please place an item on the March 14, 2017 City Commission Agenda. Action requested is the approval of entering into a Memorandum of Understanding with USD 250 regarding the Pittsburg Community Tennis Complex and authorizing the Mayor to sign the necessary document.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN USD 250 PITTSBURG COMMUNITY SCHOOLS AND THE CITY OF PITTSBURG, KANSAS

- 1. Parties. This Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter referred to as "MOU") is made and entered into by and between USD 250 Pittsburg Community Schools, whose address is 510 Deill, Pittsburg, KS 66762, and the City of Pittsburg, whose address is 201 W. 4th Street, Pittsburg, KS 66762.
- 2. <u>Purpose</u>. The purpose of this MOU is to establish the terms and conditions under which the Pittsburg Community Tennis Complex will be maintained and utilized. Previously the property of USD 250 Pittsburg Community Schools, located to the west of Pittsburg High School, 1978 E. 4th Street, Pittsburg, KS, 66762, the Pittsburg Community Tennis Complex is now a public park.
- 3. <u>Term of MOU</u>. This MOU is effective upon the day and date last signed and executed by the duly authorized representatives of the parties to this MOU and the governing bodies of the parties' respective counties or municipalities and shall remain in full force and effect in <u>perpetuity</u>.
- 4. <u>Utilities and Maintenance of Premises</u> Public utilities including electricity and water shall be paid for by USD 250 Pittsburg Community Schools. Reimbursement of utility costs may be requested when entities other than USD 250 Pittsburg Community Schools reserve the complex for special events. USD 250 Pittsburg Community Schools agrees to provide all maintenance and operational services for the Pittsburg Community Tennis Complex.
- 5. Event Scheduling Policies and Procedures Policies and procedures regarding the scheduling and use for events will be detailed in a separate document titled Policies and Procedures Regarding Scheduling and Use.

6. General Provisions

- A. Amendments. Either party may request changes to this MOU. Any changes, modifications, revisions or amendments to this MOU which are mutually agreed upon by and between the parties to this MOU shall be incorporated by written instrument, and effective when executed and signed by all parties to this MOU.
- B. Governing Law and Forum. This MOU shall be governed, interpreted and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Kansas, which shall

also be the forum for any lawsuit between the parties arising from or incident to this MOU.

C. Entirety of Agreement. This MOU represents the entire and integrated agreement between the parties and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations and agreements, whether written or oral.

Southern B Events, LLC request

Pittsburg residents Blake and Mandi Butler (Southern B Events, LLC) have recently purchased a vacant downtown building at 513 North Broadway. This property was formerly part of the Little's retail location, but was most recently an antique store. As the Butlers see a considerable need for additional event facilities in Pittsburg, they have proposed to renovate the space into a facility capable of hosting weddings, showers, birthday parties and other social events. This, along with the event center being constructed by Larry and Sooki Fields, will help fill the void created by the closing of Parrot Bey last year.

In addition to the building purchase price, the Butlers are making a sizable investment in the renovation and improvement of the property. The renovation alone is estimated at \$185,000, which includes fire suppression measures for the entire building. The Butlers have requested assistance in covering a portion of the building renovation costs.

The Economic Development Advisory Committee (EDAC) considered this request on March 1 and felt the project will improve a historic downtown property, while increasing the number of visitors downtown. As a result, the EDAC recommended

allocating \$26,500 in non-repayable funds to assist with renovations to the building, while loaning the Butlers an additional \$10,000 that will be repaid to the City. The loan would carry an interest rate of 1% and the Butlers would begin payment in one year.

Please place this item on the agenda for the City Commission meeting scheduled for Tuesday, March 13, 2017. Action being requested approval of the EDAC recommendation to provide \$26,500 in non-repayable funds to assist with renovations to the building, while loaning the Butlers an additional \$10,000 that will be repaid to the City, and authorize the Mayor to sign the appropriate documents.

Owned by Mandi Jo Butler, Southern B Events, LLC and Southern B Properties, LLC (d/b/a Butler's Quarters), located in Historic Downtown Pittsburg at 513 N. Broadway, is an all encompassing event venue that offers a wide variety of services. We can cater to your every need from venue space to event rentals. In addition to meeting all of your needs in one place, we offer event planning so your evening runs smoothly.

Southern B Events has the following objectives:

- 1. To be the primary one-stop shop for events.
- 2. Have vigorous rentals and bookings in the first 12 months.
- 3. In year 2, triple in physical location, by opening all three floors.
- 4. In year 4, have rentals and bookings more than double the first year level.

Southern B Events and Butler's Quarters is an event venue that provides a range of rental supplies for events and a downtown location perfect for your soiree. We believe in providing superior customer service and an experience that is stress free and fun.

- 1. Generate and preserve a reputation of being the premiere one-stop place for all your event needs.
- 2. Establish a strong referral network
- 3. Provide stellar customer service.
- 4. Maintain a fresh mix of rental inventory

Southern B Events and Butler's Quarters is a new event venue and rental supply company that will be a unique supplement to the existing venues in Southeast Kansas and the 4-state area. While most venues focus on one aspect, the building, the focus of SBE and BQ will be the entire event and planning process. Our core product includes: a historic 50 person, handicap accessible venue; to grow within the first 2 years to a 330 person venue in downtown Pittsburg, KS. It will include a grand mezzanine, kitchenette and serving line, bar, 3 restrooms, and a bridal room. Rental supplies include: tablecloths, table runners, napkins, backdrops, floral arrangements, table centerpieces, serve ware, and glassware. Services such as: business meetings, baby or bridal shower planning, day of coordination, reception coordination, ceremony and reception coordination, bartending, and butler's throughout the event. Our goal is to be the one-stop-shop for a stress-free, savvy and sophisticated event.

Additional information/questions from Blake:

1) How many events do you anticipate booking? 26-40 in the first year. That is two - three a month. If counting business meetings during the day as well 12-24. So anywhere from 38-64.

- 2) How much will you charge to rent the facility? Have you benchmarked other facilities to arrive at that figure? For the front, 50 people or less, I plan to rent it for \$300 for 3 hours. Anything over 3 hours will be charged an extra \$150 per hour. Need extra time to set-up, the charge is \$40/hour. When the entire building is finished I plan to rent it for \$1,750.00 with a \$430 non-refundable deposit that will be applied to your total cost. That is for a 7 hour event, and set up from 10am-4pm the day before. There will be extra packages that cost more but also include more like tablecloths. (These numbers are not currently set in stone, I will re-survey other venues next year to make sure our prices are still competitive.) That is in line with what Frisco is planning to charge (not sure on their hours), similar to Carbon Creek, when I previously surveyed other venues it was less than Memorial but now I see it is more than Memorial but still less than what The Barn and the Country Club charge.
- 3) Have you looked at how to utilize the upstairs space? Any idea how much sprinkling the entire building would add to your cost? As we want to grow this project at a manageable pace, without incurring debt, we don't plan to utilize the upstairs space for anything other than storage at this time. We estimate that with new electric, plumbing, duct work, etc and all the cosmetic work that would be required of the upstairs space, it would add another \$100,000 expense to our budget. RP3 estimates an additional \$20,000 expense to sprinkle the upstairs.

EaglePicher Technologies, LLC expansion project

EaglePicher Technologies, LLC, one of the region's longest-tenured corporate citizens for well over 140 years, is a leader in the field of batteries, battery chargers & energetic devices for defense, aerospace, commercial, oil & gas, and medical applications.

Since 2007, EaglePicher has operated an automated thermal battery production facility at 2919 Rotary Terrace in Pittsburg. EaglePicher's facility is owned by the City of Pittsburg and the company has just renewed its lease on the property for another five years. Since opening the facility with 26 employees in 2007, EaglePicher has grown its headcount at the Pittsburg facility to well over 110, including 46 positions created last year alone. These jobs feature an average wage of \$18 per hour, well above the county average.


EaglePicher and the City of Pittsburg have identified an opportunity to further grow this headcount and the company's footprint at the Pittsburg facility. To accommodate future output projections, EaglePicher will need an additional 15-20 employees (average wage of \$18 per hour) and additional equipment to include two new servo presses, heat press and stacker within the next year. This equipment alone is valued

at almost \$3 million. As the company has maximized its space at the Pittsburg facility, this growth will necessitate a 1,600 square foot building expansion, along with the addition of 30 parking spots. EaglePicher estimates the cost of the building expansion at \$225,000, while the parking lot expansion is valued at \$125,000.

On March 1, 2017, the Economic Development Advisory Committee (EDAC) considered a request to utilize the Revolving Loan Fund (RLF) to cover costs associated with the building and parking lot expansion. After touring the Pittsburg EaglePicher facility and meeting with company officials, the EDAC unanimously recommended committing \$225,000 in non-repayable RLF funds toward the building expansion, while the City public works department will perform the parking lot expansion work. This represents an investment of approximately 10% of the total project cost, with EaglePicher providing the additional 90%.

Please place this item on the agenda for the City Commission meeting scheduled for Tuesday, March 13, 2017. Action being requested is approval or denial of the EDAC recommendation and, if approved, authorize the Mayor to sign the appropriate documents.

The CPA expenses and delinquent taxes were paid in full, reports and all known corporation business was up to date by October of that year. As a result of the large monthly payment for the new building, the board created a financial plan that sufficed for the markets success well into the future. The plan required extensive volunteering and fundraising because the vendor fees were already at a maximum, but the market membership was growing and we were fortunate to have a record number of members which continued into 2016. Last spring we were surprised with an unexpected and overdue \$7000.00 property tax bill from 2015 which had not reached the current board of directors. With Crawford County's help and support we filed an appeal with the state for exempt status but the effort was unsuccessful. At that time we realized it would not be possible to remain vendor owned without substantial financial assistance due to the property expenses. We contacted Brad Snow of the Watco Foundation for advice in seeking a solution to address the building taxes and that meeting ultimately led to the new Pittsburg Area Farmers Market. We are grateful to the City for taking on this endeavor and very excited for its future.

A farmers market that I envision for Pittsburg should:

- Support and encourage local producer owned businesses by providing a fair operating environment which will in turn help keep money circulating within the Pittsburg community.
- Provide the availability of local fresh produce and products to customers who can interact and learn about their purchases from the producers.
- Create a pleasant family friendly Pittsburg destination in which all citizens will feel comfortable and welcome.





The last Saturday of every month is SAMPLER SATURDAY!


In order to comply with *KSDA rules, all sampling will be allowed on the last Saturday of the month only. We encourage everyone to offer some kind of small sample in their booth. It can be a simple small sample or you can go all out if you want to. You can stick to a small bite of your newest vegetable or you can drag out the electric skillet and do a little stir fry demo.

Sampling is a great opportunity to increase sales. Research shows that customers usually buy what they sample. Follow these guidelines for successful sampling:

- 1. Keep hot samples hot and cold samples cold. A bowl of ice, a cooler, an electric skillet or a crock pot work great. Keep samples covered.
- 2. Use tooth picks, napkins, wax paper, anything disposable to serve your sample on.
- 3. Use tongs or serving utensils to serve samples. Never use your bare hands.
- 4. Keep clean and dirty utensils in separate ziploc bags or containers.
- 5. Explain the contents of the sample when you offer it to a customer.
- 6. Offer the recipe. Have copies ready to hand out.
- 7. Run a special or sale on the produce or product that you offered samples of.
- 8. Provide a trash can. Point it out.
- 9. Keep a neat appearance.
- 10. Smile and have a great time!

*The KSDA permits the distribution of samples at Kansas Farmers Market given:

- Sampling occurs only on days designated
- · Potentially hazardous foods are not used




