Recommendation of the Planning Commission

Request to Rezone the Property Located to the South of Bitner Addition and North of Centennial Drive, from R1-A, Single Family Residential, to

R1-B, Single Family Residential

The Planning Commission/Board of Zoning Appeals, in its meeting of June 25, 2018 considered a request submitted by Mickey Vena, P&L Development, LLC to rezone the area located to the South of Bitner Addition and North of Centennial Drive, from R1-A, Single Family Residential, to R1-B, Single Family Residential to allow for the future construction of a residential development.

The property is currently zoned R1-A, Single Family Residential.

After reviewing all the evidence presented, the Planning Commission/Board of Zoning Appeals voted unanimously to recommend to the Governing Body **APPROVAL** of this rezoning request based on the following criteria:

- 1. Character of the neighborhood. This will be a new housing subdivision.
- 2. **Zoning and uses of nearby properties.** Zoning to the North is R1-A, South is IP-3, East is in the County and West is a mixture of multiple zones.
- 3. Suitability of the subject property for the uses to which it is being considered. The property is being rezoned to meet future development.

- 4. Length of time the subject property has remained vacant as zoned. The property has been vacant for many years and not developed since it was annexed into the City.
- 5. The extent to which removal of the restrictions will detrimentally affect the nearby property. Rezoning the subdivision should not have a detrimental effect to the area since the entire subdivision will be zoned as a whole.
- 6. **Relative gain to public health, safety, & welfare.** Health, Safety, & Welfare should not be adversely affected by the rezoning of the property.
- 7. Conformance to Master Plan. This conforms to the master plan.
- 8. **Staff Recommendation:** Approve. This area will be developed into a much-needed housing development and will have positive impact on the area.

In this regard, would you please place this item on the agenda for the City Commission meeting scheduled for Tuesday, July 10, 2018. Action necessary will be for the Governing Body to consider the recommendation of the Planning Commission/Board of Zoning Appeals and, if they are in agreement with the recommendation as provided, approve the request. If the Governing Body is not in agreement with the recommendation as provided, the State Statutes stipulate that the Governing Body, by a 2/3 majority, may override the recommendation or may return the recommendation to the Planning Commission/Board of Zoning Appeals for further consideration. A return of the recommendation must be accompanied with a statement specifying the basis for the Governing Body's returning the recommendation.



A RESOLUTION CONFIRMING THE CITY OF PITTSBURG'S PRIORITY OF PROJECTS 69-019 KA-1554-02 AND 69-019 KA-1554-03 TO UPGRADE THE US-69 HIGHWAY FROM THE US-69/K-47 JUNCTION NORTH TO THE BOURBON COUNTY/CRAWFORD COUNTY LINE TO A FOUR-LANE EXPRESSWAY.

**WHEREAS,** the City of Pittsburg values their good working relationship with the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT), and

**WHEREAS,** the Kansas Legislature has authorized KDOT to bond \$400,000,000 for FY 2018 and FY 2019, to fund delayed Transportation Works projects; and

**WHEREAS,** the completion of a four-lane expressway between Pittsburg and Kansas City represents significant economic development opportunities; and

**WHEREAS,** upon confirming commitment of the delayed projects, the Secretary of Transportation shall implement the construction, improvement and reconstruction of the Transportation Works projects in the most cost-effective manner to maximize savings.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the City Commission of the City of Pittsburg, Crawford County, Kansas, as follows:

Section 1. That the Pittsburg City Commission confirms its priority of projects 69-019 KS-1554-02 and 69-019 KA-1554-03 to upgrade the US-69 Highway from the US-69/K-47 junction north to the Bourbon County/Crawford County line to a four-lane expressway.

- Section 2. That the Pittsburg City Commission is committed to the construction of projects 69-019 KS-1554-02 and 69-019 KA-1554-03.
- Section 3. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption.

Section 4. The City Clerk is directed to provide a certified copy of this Resolution to the Kansas Secretary of Transportation.

#### RECITALS

- 1. KDHE is a duly authorized agency of the State of Kansas. K.S.A. 75-5601, *et seq*. The Secretary of KDHE has the authority under K.S.A. 65-3454(a)(6) to enter into contracts or agreements with any person or company to conduct necessary remediation of pollution and contamination.
- 2. KDHE has identified heavy metals contamination resulting from former smelting activities at a site known as "Weir City Zinc Works No. 2" at 2811 N. Broadway, Pittsburg, Crawford County, Kansas (Site), ISL # C3-019-71735.
- 3. The identified contaminants of concern at the Site include arsenic and lead within the soil. KDHE has determined that these contaminants pose a threat to public health or the environment pursuant to K.S.A. 65-3430, *et seq.*, and that this AGREEMENT serves the best interest of the affected public.
- 4. KDHE conducted a supplemental investigation and determined Areas of Concern (AOC) in a non-residential setting, consisting of a commercial area of development within the boundaries of the City. The concerned property is in need of soil remediation to facilitate economic development of the property thus promoting future prosperity within the City. The proposed excavated soil material is a mix of soil, smelter waste, rock, and brick. KDHE will remove large debris (i.e. concrete footings, concrete pads, etc.) within the footprint of the repository, set the material to the side, and not include it in the repository. KDHE will stage the large debris onsite in an area agreed to by the City. The City will be responsible for disposal of the large debris according to Kansas laws. The AOC include five delineated locations of metals within the soil [see exhibit A].

5. KDHE is providing Remedial Action services to assist in the encapsulation of contaminated soils above the non-residential Risk-Based Standards of Kansas (RSK) within the subsurface beneath the location of a planned road (North Walnut Street extension) by the City [see exhibit B].

#### AGREEMENT OF THE PARTIES

Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-3453(a)(6), the PARTIES to this AGREEMENT agree to the following:

- 6. KDHE agrees to remediate the site based on non-residential RSK levels by excavating the contaminated soil and placing it in a below ground repository. For lead, the non-residential RSK level is 1,000 mg/kg. For arsenic, the non-residential RSK level is 63.2 mg/kg.
- 7. The City shall be responsible for providing a road design that includes a below road repository that can accommodate the placement of approximately 3,000 cubic yards of contaminated material from the excavation areas. The road design should also include space beneath it for an additional 18 inches of clean protective soil above the entirety of the 3,000 cubic yards of material. KDHE will be responsible for placing eighteen (18) inches of clean protective soil above the contaminated material in the repository. Costs associated with placement of more than 3,000 cubic yards of contaminated material shall be borne by KDHE.
- 8. KDHE will be provided an opportunity to review and provide timely comments on the repository trench location and backfill placement methods and specifications.
- 9. The City shall be responsible for construction staking of the repository trench location.
- 10. KDHE shall fund and provide the consultant/contractor labor and necessary equipment and supplies for excavating the repository trench and placing the contaminated soils, rock, and brick into the trench based on the City engineering plans and specifications. KDHE agrees to stockpile the excavated clean soil from the repository on site and use as backfill in the excavated areas of concern and for the clean soil cover above the contaminated material backfilled into the repository trench. Any remaining clean soil will be left for use by the City.


- 11. The City will have the opportunity to provide construction oversight during the backfilling and compaction of the repository. KDHE agrees that standard industry practice methods of compaction will be used to attempt to reach the design compaction specifications needed for the repository backfill. Material shall be placed in successive horizontal layers distributed uniformly over the full width of the excavation area (lifts). Each lift of material shall not exceed nine (9) inches in thickness (loose state) and shall be compacted as required before the next lift is placed thereon. As the compaction of each layer progresses, continuous blading may be required to level the surface and ensure uniform compaction. Based on whether the materials are plastic or nonplastic, compaction of the embankment shall be such that either the tamping or sheepsfoot roller, while rolling the layer of lift, will walk-out of the material and ride the top portion of the lift (for plastic materials) or rolled using a smooth drum roller (for non-plastic materials). The moisture content of the soil at the time of compaction shall be uniform as practical and shall have a sufficient amount of moisture to aid in an appropriate level of compaction. Construction shall not be performed when material contains frost, is frozen, or a blanket of snow prevents proper compaction.
- 12. KDHE will place temporary earthen berms around the up-gradient portions of the repository during the backfilling process to minimize the volume of water runoff into the repository. KDHE will allow any water that enters the repository to remain. If the City wishes to have any runoff water removed from the repository during the backfilling activities, it will be the City's responsibility to remove and manage the water appropriately.
- 13. Once the repository has been filled and compacted to standards specified in item 11 of the AGREEMENT, the City agrees that KDHE, KDHE's consultant and the excavation contractor will not be held liable for any potential issues with the repository/road including settling of the repository/road or the adequacy of the repository/road as it relates to KDHE's placement of the material in the repository. The placement and compaction of the repository material is done with the understanding by the executing parties that the performance of the compacted repository material cannot be estimated or predicted.

- 14. The City agrees to maintain the roadway and applicable right of way to ensure the integrity of the roadway will be maintained to protect the buried contaminated material. The repository will be subject to annual inspection by KDHE.
- 15. KDHE will place an Environmental Use Control (EUC) on the property including the repository. The City will abide by the conditions of the EUC and not disturb the impacted materials placed in the repository. KDHE's Orphan Sites Program shall be responsible for the application fee of the EUC.
- 16. The City and its Contractors release and discharge KDHE from any and all charges, complaints, claims, liabilities, actions, damages, costs, or expenses of any nature whatsoever, statutory or non-statutory, known or unknown (collectively "Claims"), arising from the waste consolidation from the former Weir City Zinc Works #2 site, whether performed or executory (for which this document operates as a discharge of any outstanding or remaining obligations), including any and all claims for exposure to contaminated materials of any kind and constructability issues associated with the emplacement of the waste material. KDHE is liable for an act or omission of its employees, agents, assigns, or contractors as allowed by the Kansas Tort Claims Act, K.S.A. 75-6101 *et seq.* The State of Kansas, and KDHE by extension, is self-insured.
- 17. This AGREEMENT may only be amended in writing, by mutual agreement between the PARTIES. Such amendment(s) shall become effective as of the date on which such amendment(s) are signed by both Parties and shall be incorporated into this AGREEMENT.
- 18. This AGREEMENT will terminate upon the City's receipt of written notice from KDHE that all terms of the AGREEMENT have been satisfactorily completed.
- 19. The signatories to this AGREEMENT certify that they are legally authorized to execute and to legally bind the respective parties that they represent. The PARTIES are estopped from asserting that the signatories are not so legally authorized.



Dear Pittsburg City Commissioners,

On April 23, 2018, three weeks after the City was forced to close off a portion of west 5th Street, members of the Economic Development Advisory Committee (EDAC) met and expressed their concern about the future of the dilapidated property at 113 W. 5th Street. The group encouraged the City to take action, stating that neglected and substandard properties discourage economic development and present a safety concern.

The volunteer board unanimously voted to authorize the City to utilize the economic development revolving loan fund to demolish the dilapidated property, in order to create an economic development opportunity, expanding the City's economic base by creating new jobs, generating additional sales tax and increasing property valuation. The committee approved this funding with the expressed desire to maximize economic impact of the property, and find the greatest return on the City's investment of taxpayer dollars.

April 24, 2018, the City Commission voted to use RLF funds to incentivize redevelopment of the property by a revenue-producing entity. Following the commission's decision, the City acquired the title for the property from the former owner and began the demolition process.

On Monday, May 7, more than a month after barricades blocked off 5th Street to pedestrians, the City began demolition of the building between 5th Street Bar and Grill and Dittman Insurance. Significant attention was paid to saving the integrity of both adjacent businesses during the demolition phase. With the three buildings sharing party walls, the process was done with extreme care, to prevent damage to both structures and protect the two active businesses that operate on that side of the street.

With the lot cleared and the rubble moved away, the City was ready to put the property back into productive use. The City decided to open up a competitive process by which businesses could submit their ideas for the future use of the property. The City received two letters of intent from interested businesses, hoping to repurpose the lot. In the interest of gathering feedback from citizens, City staff requested that the Downtown

Advisory Board review the two proposals and provide a formal recommendation to the City Commission.

After a long discussion, the DAB recommended a proposal submitted by Rise Redevelopment, LLC, a real estate development company planning to relocate their headquarters to Pittsburg. The DAB also submitted a document explaining the rationale behind their recommendation, and answering some of the questions asked by members of the community, who have weighed in on social media.

Dear Commissioners,

This is our Letter of Intent for the redevelopment of the 113 W. 5<sup>th</sup> Street lot. Our vision for the property would be as follows: The creation of an enclosed patio/outdoor event center. The entire lot would be under roof divided into three equal spaces running the depth of the property. The east 1/3 would consist of a patio/outdoor dining area attached to 5<sup>th</sup> Street Bar & Grill along with 2 new bathrooms. The framing would be done in such a manner as to add structural support to our existing building. The patio/outdoor dining area would have three openings (16' overhead doors) on the interior that would open to the remaining 2/3rds of the space, consisting of a small office and storage area on the south wall. The overhead doors would allow the patio area to be weatherized if necessary. The remaining space would be used as an enclosed outdoor event center complete with retractable stage, sound system, and lighting. This space, along with the patio area, could be used for live entertainment, DJs, private parties/events, games, plus various other entertainment activities. The 5<sup>th</sup> Street frontage would consist of a façade that meets City requirements. The front of 5<sup>th</sup> Street Bar & Grill would be remodeled to blend with the new construction. The façade would consist of windows, wrought iron fencing, stone accents, plus an awning along the front of the building. A rendering will be available the night of 7/10 at the commission meeting.

We plan to design and construct the facility such that it could be repurposed into three separate buildings if the need or desires ever changed in the future.

This is a once in a lifetime opportunity for us to expand our existing business and bring a venue to the downtown area that is unique to Pittsburg and all Southeast Kansas. We have the experience with existing ownership and personnel to operate the facility. We have owned 5<sup>th</sup> Street Bar & Grill since 12/20/2012 and Kyle Mullen, Managing Member, has worked there since 2010. My background is in finance. I spent 10 years in the banking industry, leaving the bank as Exec. Vice President/CEO. Since October of 1986, I have been a self-employed Certified Financial Planner practitioner. I served 16 years on the CUSD 101 school board and while on the school board, served two years on the Southeast Kansas Education Service Center board. I currently serve on the Neosho Memorial Regional Medical Center board and have been a trustee for over 15 years. For the past three years I have also served on the Neosho Memorial Hospital Foundation plus I also currently serve on the Crestwood Country Club board here in Pittsburg.

We anticipate the project would create up to 18 additional full and part time job opportunities. We also anticipate hosting events that could help draw people downtown and provide entertainment for

those already there. This venue would allow us to support both local and out of town bands/musicians and hopefully draw new customers to the downtown area. This biggest issue we here is that you can eat and drink downtown but there are few entertainment opportunities downtown. This project could be done by us in no other location in Pittsburg.

We have no other development project experience but we have already invested over \$500,000 in Pittsburg between two businesses and rental property. Without this expansion, we believe our existing business could suffer as we cannot offer additional services while being land locked. Our potential increase in sales would also potentially help the sales of our local vendors who also pay taxes.

If awarded the lot, a detailed development plan will be drafted and executed within 120 days from the execution of a purchase agreement for the property. That agreement will include detailed design plans and will be provided to the City for review and approval. We plan to utilize a wood frame, steel and brick/stone building. We plan to utilize local, licensed contractors/subcontractors for this project.

We are prepared to offer \$42,500 for the property, provided there are no issues with the lot that require additional remediation. We would plan to commence the project within six months and expect the project to take less than 12 months for completion. We are not requesting any City funding other than possibly utilizing the Revolving Loan Fund for bridge financing, if needed, and Neighborhood Revitalization incentives.

# **DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT**

THIS DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT, hereinafter referred to as "Agreement", made this 10th day of July, 2018, by and between, the City of Pittsburg, Kansas, hereinafter referred to as "the City" and RISE REDEVELOPMENT LLC, hereinafter referred to as "Developer", whose address is 11 NORTON ST, BOSTON MA 01236-1414. RISE REDEVELOPMENT LLC further agrees to establish a new local development company with an office located within the limits of the City of Pittsburg named 374 North LLC for all its development projects in the local area. Further, RISE REDEVELOPMENT LLC and/or its subsidiaries does not seek or request city funds for this project.

The City hereby covenants and agrees that for the sum of \$45,000.00 and if the Developer shall perform the covenants and agreements hereinafter mentioned on the Developer's part to be performed, then the City will cause to be conveyed to the Developer, in fee simple, clear of all encumbrances, except for easements and restrictions of record, by a municipal warranty deed, to the following described property in Pittsburg, Crawford County, Kansas, to-wit:

# 113 West 5th Street;

The legal description of which is: <u>PITTSBURG ORIGINAL TOWN, West 72'10" OF East 96'10" Lots 335, 336, Block 21.</u>

Restrictions and covenants placed upon the property by the City of Pittsburg, Kansas are attached hereto, incorporated herein and made a part hereof.

Developer hereby covenants that it will contract with duly licensed construction professionals within the City of Pittsburg, Kansas and will insure they hold licensure in good standing during construction of the development that is the subject of this Agreement.

# **DEFINITIONS**

The following definitions will apply throughout this Agreement:

- The City: The City of Pittsburg is a legal municipality in the state of Kansas
- **Developer:** The Developer is the person, persons, or entity who will be responsible for the construction of the agreed Development on the real estate. The Developer is responsible for any contractors or subcontractors hired to complete the construction process.
- **Financer:** The individual or institution that provides financial backing for the development.
- **Building Services:** The City of Pittsburg's Building Services employees, including the Building Official and Building Inspectors.

## **DEVELOPMENT PLAN**

A Detailed Development Plan will be drafted and executed within 120 days from the execution of this Development Agreement.

The Development Plan will include detailed design plans and drawings of the development, which will be provided to Building Services for initial review on or before August 31, 2018. The Development Plan will outline that the Developer agrees to commence the construction of <u>a three-story wood frame, steel and brick building with 8 luxury condo lofts on the upper floors and commercial space on the 1st level that replicates the façade of the original structure upon the above described real estate no later than 180 days of the date of entering into the Development Plan, and complete construction, including a Certificate of Occupancy being issued, within 18-24 months from the date of entering into this the Development Plan. Developer further agrees that the three-story wood frame, steel and brick building with 8 luxury condo lofts on the upper floors and commercial space on the 1st level that replicates the façade of the original structure, hereinafter referred to as the "Development", shall include the following:</u>

Architectural & Engineering Plans, Schedule of Development, Builder's Risk Insurance Policy, Budget Package, etc.

All drawings and construction plans shall be approved by the City of Pittsburg's Building Services Department prior to finalizing the Development Plan. No changes shall be made to the construction plans and drawings without the prior written approval of the City of Pittsburg.

## **DEED**

The deed shall be delivered to Developer upon delivery of the \$45,000.00 agreed amount and execution of this Development Agreement.

# **INSURANCE**

Developer shall procure, obtain and maintain insurance to protect the Developer, as well as the City and each parties' agents, officials, officers, and employees from damages resulting from errors, omissions and negligent acts of Developer, its agents, officers, employees and subcontractors in the performance of the work to be performed pursuant to this Agreement. The policies of insurance shall include as a minimum:

A) Worker's Compensation and Employer Liability coverage with an "all states" endorsement. Said insurance policies shall also cover claims for injury, disease or death of employees arising out of and in the course of their employment, which, for any reason, may not fall within the provisions of the Workman's Compensation Law. The liability limit shall not be less than:

Workman's Compensation – Statutory Employer's Liability - \$500,000.00 each occurrence

- B) Motor vehicle liability coverage of at least \$1,000,000.00 combined single limits liability coverage for bodily injury, death, personal injury or property damage; and
  - C) A comprehensive commercial general liability policy, including an endorsement for products liability and completed operations, protecting against all claims arising from injury or death to persons (other than Developer's employees) or damage to property of the City or others arising out of any error, omission or negligent act of Developer, its agents, officers, employees or subcontractors in connection with Developer's work pursuant to this Agreement. The liability limit shall not be less than \$1,000,000.00 per occurrence for bodily injury, death and property damage.

Satisfactory certificates of insurance shall be filed with the City Clerk prior to the Developer performing work on the premises. No policy insuring only "claims made" during its policy term will be acceptable. In addition,

insurance policies applicable hereto shall contain a provision providing that the City shall be given thirty (30) days advance written notice by any insurance company before such policy is substantially changed or cancelled.

#### INDEMNIFICATION AND HOLD HARMLESS

The Developer expressly agrees and covenants that it will hold and save harmless and indemnify the City and its agents, officials, officers, employees and authorized representatives from any and all causes of action, penalties, fines, losses, costs, liabilities, expenses, attorney fees, suits, judgments and damages to persons or property or claims of any nature whatsoever arising out of or in connection with the provisions or performance of this Agreement by the Developer, its employees and subcontractors.

The Developer shall also insert in its contracts with each subcontractor a clause that requires the subcontractor to also indemnify and hold harmless the City and its agents, officials, officers, employees and authorized representatives from any and all causes of action, penalties, fines, losses, costs, liabilities, expenses, attorney fees, suits, judgments and damages to persons or property or claims of any nature whatsoever arising out of or in connection with the provisions or performance of all subcontracts by the subcontractor and its employees.

## **FINANCING**

Financing for this Development is provided by <u>a Regulation D 506(b) capital raise</u>, by <u>qualified investors</u>. <u>If Developer fails to meet the terms of this Agreement</u>, the Financier has first option to take ownership of the real estate, including any improvements made to the real estate by the Developer.

Should Developer fail to commence construction of the Development within 180 days of entering into the Development Plan, then the transfer of the above-described real estate shall be rendered null and void and Developer shall convey the real estate back to the City by warranty deed.

The Developer will submit to the City a copy of the permit for temporary electrical service for the period of construction. This permit shall serve as evidence of commencement of construction. The City will provide a copy of the permit as well as a letter verifying the commencement of construction of the Development to the Financier.

# **TAXES**

Taxes and assessments on the above-described real estate shall be paid by the Developer from the date this Agreement is executed and going forward.

# PLAN APPROVAL AND INSPECTION

The Developer is responsible for submitting plans to Building Services, obtaining the appropriate permits, and working with Building Services staff to schedule and conduct appropriate inspections.

# SITE INFRASTRUCTURE

Permits are required from Building Services for the construction of any subsurface structure designed to collect or transport storm and/or sanitary wastewater. The Developer is responsible for obtaining any applicable permits related to the construction of water and/or sanitary sewer lines. The Developer is responsible for any costs associated with the placement of sewer taps at the construction site. The Developer is responsible for any costs related to the inspection of such structures.

## **CURBING AND SIDEWALKS**

The Developer agrees to install sidewalk(s) along the frontage of the lot on 5th Street; these sidewalks will follow the design standards as described in the Typical Sidewalk Specifications document. If the existing sidewalk(s) is damaged, the Developer agrees to replace it with a sidewalk(s) that follows the design standards as described in the Typical Sidewalk Specifications document. If the existing curbing is damaged, the Developer agrees to replace it with curbing that follows the design standards as described in the Private Driveway Specifications document. The Developer also agrees to follow the design standards for driveway approaches, as described in the Private Driveway Specifications document.

## **DEFAULT**





I hope the below effectively highlights my interests, past involvement, and motivations for applying to the City of Pittsburg's Sustainability Advisory Committee.

For the past three years I have served as the Sustainability, Society and Resource Management degree program coordinator at Pittsburg State University. In this role I have gained valuable experience in both theory, research and application of sustainability initiatives in institutions of higher education and communities, both large and small. In this role I have participated in a variety of professional development activites such as traveling to national and international conferences, and working with several environmentally-focused organizations in the 4-state region. In the spring of 2017 my students completed 'Impact 2022' a five-year planning strategy for PSU's university sustainability efforts, and several of the objectives have already been achieved.
