4th Street Traffic Study

With residential development starting in the area between 4<sup>th</sup> Street (K-126) and Quincy Street to the west of Free King Highway, the City Commission expressed interest in having a roadway that would connect the developments from 4<sup>th</sup> Street to Quincy Street that does not utilize Deer Run Lane as the connection onto Quincy. As a first step to that design, KDOT requires a Traffic Impact Study (TIS) for the connection onto 4<sup>th</sup> Street. The lead time for KDOT review and approval could be several months. Once the TIS is approved, the City can better scope out the design of the roadway with the KDOT requirements at the connection to 4<sup>th</sup> Street in mind.

The City requested qualifications for coordinating the road design and residential developers from two of its on-call engineering firms and the staff recommends selecting Olsson with its Pittsburg office to perform the TIS, future design and coordination efforts. Olsson's has submitted a not-to-exceed cost of \$24,000 to perform the TIS.

In this regard, would you please place this item on the agenda for the City Commission meeting scheduled for Tuesday, November 24, 2020. Action being requested is to approve or disapprove staff's request, and, if approved, authorize the Mayor and staff to sign the appropriate documents on behalf of the City of Pittsburg.

#### **SCOPE OF SERVICES**

Olsson shall provide the following services (Scope of Services) to Client for a traffic study for a proposed residential development generally located south of Highway 126 (4<sup>th</sup> Street), west of Free King Highway, north of Quincy Street, and east of Rouse Avenue in Pittsburg, Kansas. This study will be based off the current master plan for the site to be provided by the City. The scope and fee were determined based on a phone discussion with Brian Coomes on 11.05.2020. City of Pittsburg and Kansas Department of Transportation staff have provided input regarding this proposed scope of services.

#### Phase 100 - Traffic Study

#### Task 101 - Traffic Counts

Turning movement traffic volume counts will be collected for typical weekday AM (7-9) and PM (2-6) peak periods at the following intersections. The extended afternoon peak is to take into consideration the nearby Pittsburg High School. Pedestrian counts will be included in the data collection.

- 1. K-126 and Rouse Avenue
- 2. K-126 and Canterbury Road
- 3. K-126 and Free King Highway
- 4. Quincy Street and Rouse Avenue
- 5. Quincy Street and Free King Highway

Travel patterns have been impacted due to the current COVID-19 pandemic. The City has historical turning movement traffic count data for the intersection of K-126 and Free King Highway. To determine if a reduction in traffic volumes is still occurring due to closures and stay-at-home orders, historical data for the intersection will be compared to data collected for this study to determine if a percent decrease in current traffic volumes is occurring. Intersection turning movement counts will be adjusted, if appropriate, to obtain a base traffic count.

#### Task 102 - Site Investigation

Olsson will conduct an investigation of the roadway system surrounding the proposed development to determine existing conditions such as intersection geometrics, intersection and driveway spacing, and existing traffic control. Current Pittsburg High School operations will be included in this investigation. The current High School ingress and egress operations plan will be provided by the school.

#### Task 103 – K-126 and Free King Highway Existing Study Review

Olsson will review existing traffic studies provided by the City and KDOT that reviewed the intersection of K-126 and Free King Highway. The recommendations from the studies, if relevant, may be included in our analysis and recommendations.

Signal warrant analysis and roundabout recommendations are not included in this phase. See Add-Services Task 201 for these items.

#### Task 104 – Trip Generation/Distribution

Trip generation will be estimated for typical daily, AM and PM peak hour traffic based on the Institute of Transportation Engineering (ITE) Trip Generation Manual, most recent edition. Trip generation will be conducted for the full master planned development as well as any nearby anticipated developments.

#### Task 105 - Capacity Analysis

Olsson will conduct capacity and queuing analysis of the proposed development for the typical weekday AM and PM peak hour for the following four scenarios:

- 1. Existing Conditions
- 2. Build Year Conditions
- 3. Build Year Conditions with Full-Build Development
- 4. Future Conditions (20-year) with Full-Build Development

These analysis scenarios are based on discussions with the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT).

Capacity analysis will provide the basis for determining appropriate traffic control and geometric improvements. Queuing analysis will provide the basis for determining the needed length of any auxiliary lanes. Capacity and queuing analysis will be conducted for the study intersections listed in Task 101 as well as proposed site drives.

#### Task 106 – Crash History

Olsson will analyze the last 3 years of crash history at the study intersections to determine if there is a crash pattern that is correctable and calculate an intersection crash rate. Olsson will request crash reports through KDOT open records request for a copy of the full accident report.

It is assumed that accident diagrams will not be required as a part of this task.

#### Task 107 - Sight Distance

Olsson will field measure and document sight distance at the proposed site drives. The measurements will be compared to the recommended distances provided in AASHTO for intersection sight distance cases B1 and B2 and for stopping sight distance.

#### Task 108 – Traffic Impact Analysis Report

A report will be prepared to address the roadway impact from the proposed development. Recommendations pertaining to street improvements that are due to the proposed project will be made. All recommendations will be based on capacity and queuing analysis, standards set by the City and/or 2013 KDOT Access Management Policy requirements as related to a comprehensive traffic impact study, and engineering judgment.

Should Client request work in addition to the Scope of Services, Olsson shall invoice Client for such additional services (Optional Additional Services) at the standard hourly billing labor rate charged for those employees actually performing the work, plus reimbursable expenses if any. Olsson shall not commence work on Optional Additional Services without Client's prior written approval.

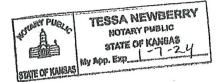

Arvest Bank/P & L Development subordination agreement

In 2018, the City issued a \$450,000 loan to P & L Development in support of the Silverback housing development. As Arvest Bank is the primary lender for the project, the bank took first position on the loan with the City securing a second position on the P & L property until the loan is repaid in December 2023. A subordination agreement outlines this ranking of creditors.

Arvest is now issuing an additional construction loan for four model homes and four speculative homes in the Silverback development. As such, while this doesn't change the City's financial obligation, it will require a new subordination agreement as it will change the City's position proportionate to the amount of the additional construction loan. The subordination agreement will also include language that releases the City's second mortgage on upon closing of each lot as it is sold.

The Economic Development Advisory Committee (EDAC) considered this request from Arvest Bank on November 19, 2020, and was encouraged by the progress of the development. As such, the EDAC voted unanimously to recommend a new subordination agreement be drafted that will allow Arvest to proceed with their construction loan.

Please place this item on the agenda for the City Commission meeting scheduled for Tuesday, November 24, 2020. Action being requested is the approval or denial of

the EDAC recommendation and, if approved, authorize the Mayor to sign the appropriate documents.

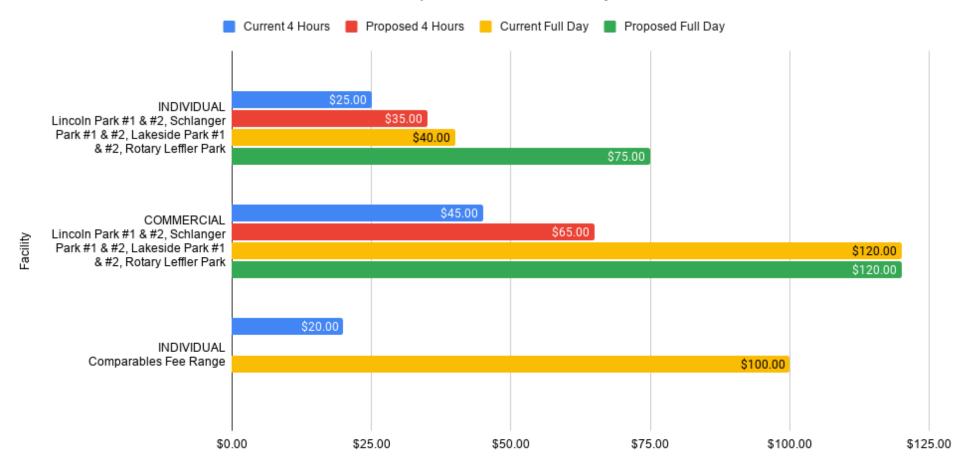

# Current vs. Proposed Pavilion Facility Fees



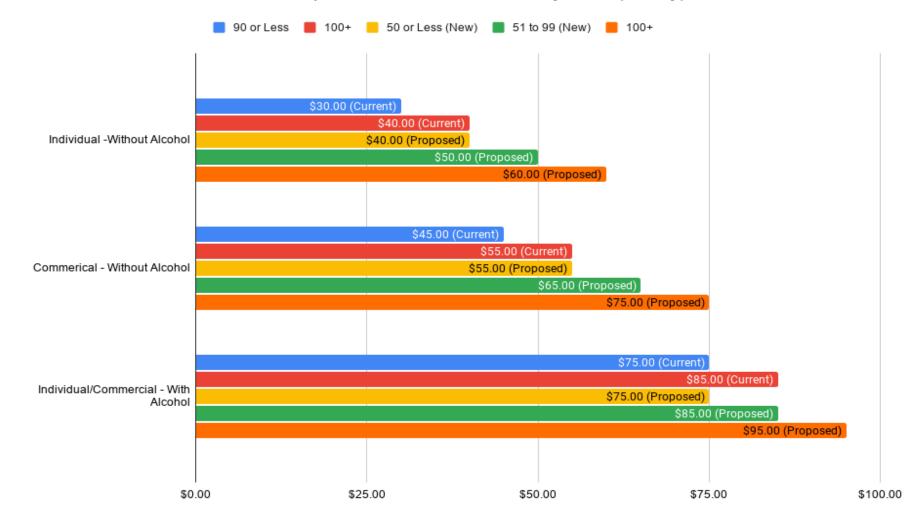

As part of the effort to provide relief from the coronavirus pandemic, the Kansas Department of Commerce made available federal funding from the State's Community Development Block Grant Coronavirus Response Supplement (CDBG-CV) program. This is part of the state's allocation from the federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act.

The City Commission approved applying for this CDBG-CV grant earlier this year. After applying for this program, the City of Pittsburg received \$128,200 to support local businesses impacted by the pandemic and \$35,000 to provide funding for local meals programs. After an extended application and review process, the City received 16 successful applications from local businesses and three successful applications from meals programs. The final funding allocation for the business program is included with this memo. The allocation for the meals program will follow at a subsequent Commission meeting.

Formal approval by the governing body of the final funding allocation is required by the CDBG program, so we will be presenting the allocation to the City Commission for its approval.

Two of the applicants (Quentin Holmes and Brittan Brenner) are City employees who have ownership positions in businesses that have been significantly affected by the pandemic, and their applications must be publicly acknowledged. Their applications are attached. They have each submitted a disclosure form and the City Attorney will render an opinion regarding their request for exception. Neither of them have a prohibited conflict of interest due to the fact that neither of them have a role in the CDBG-CV program other than as applicants; however, it must be acknowledged that they are employees who exercise or have exercised functions and responsibilities with respect to other CDBG activities and that they may obtain a personal or financial interest with respect to this program, either for themselves or those with whom they have family or business ties, during their tenure or for one year thereafter.

The disclosure of employee participation must be recorded in the official minutes of the governing body.

The shutdowns associated with COVID-19 deeply impacted our small business in many ways. Not only with the abrupt departure of not only our student customers, of whom are the main demographic of our business, but also the abrupt departure of the majority of our employees. This made business extremely difficult to conduct throughout the last few weeks we were allowed to be open. COVID-19 caused large decreases in business and delays in the reception of our orders that were placed as far back as March. Our weekly sales dropped 25% from what we were doing the two months prior. Considering the months of January and February are the slowest for retail, as we recover from the Holidays, this additional drop in sales severely hurt us financially.

#### Describe how the use of the CDBG loan fund enhances the ability of this business to survive.

By receiving these funds, we will have more working capital to spend on additional merchandise in the store. Under normal circumstances, the longstanding inventory would be marked down so there was room for new inventory to come in. We are in a difficult position where we cannot afford to markdown old inventory but also cannot afford/have the room for new inventory to drive customers in. This money would make it more feasible for us to purchase new and markdown to return to the normal flow of our business.
