A Regular Session of the Board of Commissioners was held at 5:30 p.m. on Tuesday, March 11th, 2025, in the City Commission Room, located in the Law Enforcement Center, 201 North Pine, with Mayor Dawn McNay presiding and the following members present: Cheryl Brooks, Stu Hite, Chuck Munsell and Ron Seglie.

Mayor McNay led the flag salute.

INVOCATION - Chaplain Pete Mayo, on behalf of Mercy Hospital Pittsburg, provided an invocation.

PROCLAMATION – Mayor McNay proclaimed the month of March, 2025, as Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities Awareness Month in Pittsburg.

PITTSBURG POSITIVE – Mayor McNay recognized City staff and the community partners for their efforts in operating the Warming Centers, located at the Homer Cole Center and the Meadowside Baptist Church, for a total of eighteen nights during the recent cold weather events.

PUBLIC INPUT – Roger Lomshek, 1147 South 220th Street, proposed that the units designated for those exiting homelessness at the multifamily community, to be constructed by the Vecino Group, be reserved for local individuals.

NON-SLIP FLOORING REPLACEMENT – AQUATIC CENTER – On motion of Seglie, seconded by Brooks, the Governing Body waived the City's formal bid policy and authorized staff to utilize the joint cooperative purchasing contract through Sourcewell to accept a quote from Insco Industries, of Kansas City, Missouri, in the amount of \$45,048.00, for the removal and replacement of all non-slip flooring in the Aquatic Center bath house, lifeguard dressing room, entry passageway and administrative office, and authorized the Mayor to sign the necessary documents on behalf of the City. Block 22 loan forgiveness

On March 13, 2018, the Pittsburg city commission approved a request from the Pittsburg State University Foundation to provide a forgivable loan in the amount of \$300,000 to support the buildout of the Block 22 restaurant/retail space. The loan was to be forgiven at \$60,000 per year, with the stipulation that the entire amount must be spent on permanent fixed improvements, all tenants should be sales tax-producing businesses and that the occupancy of the building must average no less than 65% over the previous twelve month period.

The Pittsburg City Commission has previously forgiven the loan amounts for 2020-2022. Pittsburg State University has submitted verification that it satisfied the forgiveness requirements for the years 2023 and 2024 and is eligible to have the final two years of the loan forgiven.

The Economic Development Advisory Committee (EDAC) considered this at its March 5 meeting and recommended forgiveness of the 2023 and 2024 loan payments.

Please place this item on the agenda for the City Commission meeting scheduled for Tuesday, March 25, 2025. Action being requested is approval or denial of the EDAC recommendation.



WITNESSETH:

<u>FIRST</u>: That for and in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained and the moneys hereunder to be paid, the Sellers agree to sell and the Buyer agrees to purchase approximately three (3) acres of real estate described as follows: (hereinafter the "Subject Property").

Such endorsement to be properly executed by all parties concerned and the modification shall be effective only from and after the date of such modification and execution thereof.

NINTH: Each party shall be responsible for its own attorney fees incurred in negotiation and preparation of this Agreement and the closing of the sales transaction described herein.

TENTH: In the event either party defaults in its obligations under this Agreement, then the non-defaulting party may file suit to specifically enforce this Agreement and take any other action at law it deems appropriate. The prevailing party in any such action shall be entitled to reimbursement of reasonable attorney fees incurred therein from the non-prevailing party.

<u>ELEVENTH</u>: It is mutually agreed and understood that all the covenants and agreements contained herein shall extend to and be binding upon the heirs, executors, administrators, agents, trustees, successors and assigns of the parties hereto.

<u>TWELFTH</u>: This Agreement was entered into and is to be performed in the State of Kansas and shall be governed and interpreted pursuant to Kansas law.

THIRTEENTH: This Contract shall be executed in two (2) counterparts, each of which shall be an original and shall constitute one and the same instrument.
