ADJOURNMENT

A Regular Session of the Board of Commissioners was held at 5:30 p.m. on Tuesday, October 14, 2025, in the City Commission Room, located in the Law Enforcement Center, 201 North Pine, with Mayor Dawn McNay presiding and the following members present: Cheryl Brooks, Chuck Munsell, and Ron Seglie. Commissioner Stu Hite was absent.

Mayor McNay led the flag salute.

Mayor McNay proclaimed October as Domestic Violence Prevention Month in Pittsburg.

PUBLIC INPUT -

Joella Reid-Skyles, 112 Westfield Road, spoke regarding the audio/video feed being out of sync on the streaming of recent City Commission Meetings.

Casey Brown, SEK-CAP Community Engagement Coordinator and Scott Chistiansen, SEK-CAP Transportation Director, explained the SEK-CAP transportation funding shortage and upcoming, temporary suspension of their public transportation service. Mayor McNay recommended the SEK-CAP representatives meet with City Manager Daron Hall regarding their concerns.

Humberto Lira, 200 East Quincy, encouraged the City Commission to build public soccer fields in Pittsburg.

Kristi Bitner, 1508 Bitner Court, asked questions regarding the payment to Silverback Landing, LLC, included on the Appropriation Ordinance.

Pete Mayo, on behalf of Mercy Hospital Pittsburg, provided an invocation.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES – On motion of Seglie, seconded by Brooks, the Governing Body approved the September 23, 2025, City Commission Meeting minutes as presented. Motion carried. Absent: Hite.

ORDINANCE NO. G-1376 – On motion of Seglie, seconded by Brooks, the Governing Body adopted Ordinance No. G-1376, amending Section 58-1 of the Pittsburg City Code reducing the number of board members for the Pittsburg Area Farmers Market Advisory Board from seven (7) to five (5) members, and authorized the Mayor to sign the Ordinance on behalf of the City. Motion carried. Absent: Hite.

CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT – On motion of Seglie, seconded by Brooks, the Governing Body approved the request submitted by Jose R. Constanza for a Conditional Use Permit to allow a church to operate at 302 South Broadway. Motion carried. Absent: Hite.

AIRPORT HANGAR LEASE – On motion of Seglie, seconded by Brooks, the Governing Body entered into a lease agreement in the amount of \$1,250 per month with Mullair, LLC, of Carl Junction, Missouri, for the airport hangars located at 3505 and 3507 Airport Circle, to be used for aircraft repair and maintenance, and authorized the Mayor and City Clerk to execute the lease agreement once prepared by the City Attorney. Motion carried. Absent: Hite.

CIVIL RIGHTS CERTIFICATION – On motion of Seglie, seconded by Brooks, the Governing Body approved staff request to submit a Civil Rights Certification to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) regarding the Pittsburg Public Housing Authority (PHA) Annual Plan, and authorized the Mayor to sign the necessary documents on behalf of the City. Motion carried. Absent: Hite.

ORDINANCE NO. G-1377 – On motion of Munsell, seconded by Seglie, the Governing Body adopted Ordinance No. G-1377, providing for the change of certain areas from RP-4; Planned Apartment House, to CP-2: Planned General Commercial (Summerfield Subdivision Phase II), and amending and supplementing the Zoning District Boundary Map and Zoning Ordinance No. G-663, as amended, of the City of Pittsburg, and authorized the Mayor to sign the Ordinance on behalf of the City. Motion carried. Absent: Hite.

VACATION ORDER – On motion of Munsell, seconded by Brooks, the Governing Body approved an Order vacating a portion of Linden Street, in the City of Pittsburg, Crawford County, Kansas, and authorized the Mayor to sign the Order on behalf of the City. Motion carried. Absent: Hite.

NVISION KC AGREEMENT – On motion of Munsell, seconded by Seglie, the Governing Body approved staff request to enter into an agreement with NvisionKC to develop a new application to access the existing database, documents, and image files used by the Sleuth program, in the amount of \$38,075, and authorized the Mayor to sign the agreement on behalf of the City. Motion carried. Absent: Hite.

APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE – On motion of Seglie, seconded by Munsell, the Governing Body approved the Appropriation Ordinance for the period ending October 14, 2025, subject to the release of HUD expenditures when funds are received with the following roll call vote: Yea: McNay, Munsell and Seglie. Motion carried with Brooks voting in opposition. Absent: Hite.

SPECIAL PRESENTATION – KANSAS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (KDOT) – Steve Rockers, KDOT Project Director and Jeff Fischer, KDOT Area Engineer, provided an update on the conclusion of the Highway 69 Corridor Study. Absent: Hite.

SPECIAL PRESENTATION - BUILDING HEALTH, INC. – Becky Gray, Director of Building Health, Inc., and Cassie Jones, Transportation Program Manager of Building Health, Inc., provided an update on General Public Transportation in Crawford County, and requested a letter of support for their program. Absent: Hite.

BANDSHELL RESTORATION PROJECT - DISPOSITION OF BIDS — On motion of Brooks, seconded by Seglie, the Governing Body approved staff recommendation to award the bid for the J.J. Richards Bandshell Restoration Project to Mid Central Contract Services of Pittsburg, Kansas, in the amount of \$243,700, and authorized the Mayor and City Clerk to execute the contract agreement once it is prepared. Motion carried. Absent: Hite.

NOVEMBER MEETING SCHEDULE – It was the consensus of the Governing Body to cancel the November 25, 2025, City Commission Meeting and schedule a Special City Commission Meeting to be held at 5:30 p.m. on Wednesday, November 12, 2025. Motion carried. Absent: Hite.

NON-AGENDA REPORTS & REQUESTS:

616 NORTH BROADWAY STRUCTURAL STABILIZATION – DISPOSITION OF BIDS – On motion of Munsell, seconded by Seglie, the Governing Body approved staff recommendation to reject the bid received for the structural stabilization of 616 North Broadway and authorized staff to re-bid the project. Motion carried. Absent: Hite.

AUDIT QUESTIONS – Mayor McNay asked the Commissioners if they had any questions for Stacey Hammond of BT&Co. P.A., the City's auditing firm, following the September 23, 2025, review of the City's 2024 audit and Annual Comprehensive Financial Report (ACFR). Absent: Hite.

PITT 150 GOLF TOURNAMENT FUNDRAISER – Kim Froman, Director of Community Development and Housing, announced the Pitt 150 Golf Tournament to be held on October 30th at the Four Oaks Golf Course. Funds from the tournament will be used to support the year-long event celebrating Pittsburg's 150th birthday in 2026. Absent: Hite.

NEIGHBORHOOD ADVISORY COMMITTEE CLEAN-UP DAY – Kim Froman, Director of Community Development and Housing, announced the Neighborhood Advisory Committee's Clean-Up Day scheduled for Saturday October 25th. Absent: Hite.

LETTER TO THE EDITOR RESPONSE – Commissioner Munsell and City Manager Daron Hall provided information in relation to Mr. Hall's article in The Morning Sun in response to a recent Letter to the Editor pertaining to the Deputy City Manager. Absent: Hite.

EXECUTIVE SESSION - On motion of Seglie, seconded by Munsell, the Governing Body recessed into Executive Session for fifteen minutes for preliminary discussion regarding the acquisition of real property pursuant to K.S.A. 75-4319(b)(6), to discuss the potential acquisition of recreational property, with the meeting to resume in the City Commission Room in fifteen minutes. Subject: Amendments to Select City Alcohol Codes

The Police Department is seeking approval from the Pittsburg City Commission to amend select codes in the city ordinance regarding alcohol, specifically the four following sections:

Section 6-2. - Prohibiting entry of persons under age 21

Section 6-74. – Applicant disqualification

Section 6-205. – License; disqualification

A recent review of the city's codes under Chapter 6, Alcoholic Beverages, showed that some of the city's ordinances need to be updated to reflect aspects of current state statutes.

These changes include the following:

Section 6-2. – Prohibiting entry of persons under age 21

Removal of *original* subsection (d)(2), which makes reference to a dance event on the licensed premises. (*The city's dance hall license was repealed a couple of years ago, rendering this subsection irrelevant.*)

Section 6-74. – Applicant disqualification

Removal of *original* subsection (2), which makes reference to an applicant (for a Cereal Malt Beverage license) being disqualified for being a person "who is not of good character and reputation in the community in which he resides." This change will bring the ordinance into line with state statute (K.S.A. 41-2703).

And;

Modification of *original* subsection (3), to remove the phrase "or has been adjudged guilty of" regarding an applicant for a Cereal Malt Beverage license. This change will bring the ordinance into line with state statute (K.S.A. 41-2703). (*There is already a reference in this section for the applicant being convicted of offenses related to the license application, rendering this term redundant.)*

And;

Modification of *original* subjection (5), to include the phrase "other than the citizenship requirements" regarding members of a corporation owing 25% or more of the stock of that corporation. This change will bring the ordinance into line with state statute (K.S.A. 41-2703).

Section 6-205. – License; disqualification

Removal of *original* subsection (1) from the ordinance, which makes reference to an applicant (for an Enhanced Cereal Malt Beverage license) being disqualified for not residing in the state at least one year prior to applying for the license and for not being a resident of Crawford County at least six months before the filing of the application. This change will bring the ordinance into line with state statute (K.S.A. 41-2703).

And;

Removal of *original* subsection (3), which makes reference to an applicant (for an Enhanced Cereal Malt Beverage license) being disqualified for being a person "who is not of good character and reputation in the community in which he resides." This change will bring the ordinance into line with state statute (K.S.A. 41-2703).

And;

Modification of *original* subsection (4) to add the phrase "released from incarceration for, or released from probation or parole," and remove the phrase "or has been adjudged guilty of" regarding an applicant for an Enhanced Cereal Malt Beverage license. This change will bring the ordinance into line with state statute (K.S.A. 41-2703).

And;

Modification of *original* subsection (6) to change from the phrase "other than non-residence within the City or County" to "other than the citizenship requirements," regarding members of a corporation owing 25% or more of the stock of that corporation. This change will bring the ordinance into line with state statute (K.S.A. 41-2703).

And;

Modification of *original* subsection (9) to change from the phrase "other than citizenship, retailer residency requirements or age" to "other than citizenship

requirements or age," regarding an applicant for an Enhanced Cereal Malt Beverage license whose spouse would be ineligible to receive a retailer's license. This change will bring the ordinance into line with state statute (K.S.A. 41-2703).

Copies of the requested amended ordinances have been included with this memo.

The requested action will be approval or disapproval of staff's request to amend Pittsburg City Ordinances Section 6-2. – Prohibiting entry of persons under age 21, Section 6-74. – Applicant disqualification, and Section 6-205. – License; disqualification, and, if approved, authorize The Mayor to sign into effect, and have the amended ordinances published.

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ORDINANCE NO. G-1378

AN ORDINANCE, amending Section 6-2 of the Pittsburg City Code to remove the prohibition on exempt premises from allowing persons under the age of 21 from entering or remaining on the premises while a dance is occurring on the premises.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF PITTSBURG, KANSAS:

<u>Section 1.</u> Section 6-2 of the Pittsburg City Code is hereby amended to read:

Sec. 6-2. Prohibiting entry of persons under age 21.

(a) *Definitions*. The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this Section, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this subsection, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Alcoholic liquor, caterer, cereal malt beverage, class A club, class B club, club, drinking establishment, and temporary permit mean as set forth in Section 6-181.

Axe throwing club means a premises which include a minimum of four (4) axe throwing lanes and where the axes, throwing lanes, ceiling height, lane width and safety standards adhere to the restrictions and specifications set forth herein in subsection (d).

Dispense or sold means to furnish, transfer, exchange or barter in any manner or by any means whatsoever, with or without a consideration, cereal malt beverage and/or alcoholic liquor.

Food means any raw, cooked or processed edible substance or ingredient, other than alcoholic liquor or cereal malt beverage, used or intended for use or for sale, in whole or in part for human consumption.

Licensee or permit holder means either a partnership, association or corporation including the agents, officers, and employees thereof, or a natural person holding a license or permit to operate a club or drinking establishment, or holding a caterer's license, a temporary permit, or a license to sell cereal malt beverage and/or alcoholic liquor for consumption on the premises.

Outdoor entertainment and recreation area means an area that is wholly or partially outside of a fully enclosed permanent structure which is used primarily for seating, dining, broadcast, recreational and live entertainment, and enclosed by permanent perimeter barriers.

Pool hall means a premises where the primary business relates to customers engaging in billiards or pool.

Premises means the location of any place, whether or not licensed for the sale of cereal malt beverage and/or alcoholic liquor, where either cereal malt beverage or alcoholic liquor is dispensed or sold for consumption on the premises.

Restaurant means a business that prepares and sells food directly to consumers for immediate consumption on the premises.

Recreational, broadcast and live entertainment means any entertainment activity provided for pleasure, enjoyment, recreation, and relaxation including but not limited to, pre-recorded music, musical performances, movies, television programs or internet transmissions, theatrical performances, speakers, poetry readings, art exhibitions, games and other similar entertainment activities.

- (b) *Unlawful entry*; *licensee or permit holder absolutely liable*.
 - (1) It shall be unlawful and the licensee or permit holder shall be absolutely liable, whether with or without consent or knowledge, if any person under 21 years of age enters or remains upon any premises where cereal malt beverage and/or alcoholic liquor is dispensed or sold for consumption on the premises. This Section shall not apply to persons under 21 years of age who are on the premises if accompanied by a parent or a legal guardian.
 - (2) It shall be unlawful for any licensee or permit holder, or any owner, officer or employee thereof, to knowingly or unknowingly permit any 21 years of age to enter or remain upon any premises where cereal malt beverage and/or alcoholic liquor is dispensed or sold for consumption on the premises. This Section shall not apply to persons under 21 years of age who are on the premises if accompanied by a parent or legal guardian.
 - (3) It shall be a defense to the prosecution hereof if the person under 21 years of age exhibited to the defendant an unexpired driver's license, state nondriver's identification card or other official or apparently official document, containing a photograph of the person which purported to establish that such person was 21 or more years of age.
- (c) *Unlawful entry; minor*. It shall be unlawful for any person under 21 years of age to enter or remain upon the premises of a licensee or permit holder where cereal malt beverage and/or alcoholic liquor is dispensed or sold for consumption on the premises. This Section shall not apply to persons under 21 years of age who are on the premises accompanied by a parent or a legal guardian.
- (d) *Premises exempted*.
 - (1) This Section shall not apply to and shall exempt the following licensees or permit holders, and any owners, officers or employees thereof:

- i. Premises used primarily as a bowling alley;
- ii. Any member in good standing of a veteran's organization while on the premises of the veteran's organization if he is a member thereof;
- iii. A restaurant which derives at least sixty percent (60%) of its gross revenues from the bona fide sale of food for consumption on the premises;
- iv. Premises used primarily as an axe throwing club which shall include; a minimum of four (4) axe throwing lanes with a minimum ceiling height of ten (10) feet and a minimum lane width of six (6) feet within the axe throwing lanes; which prohibits the throwing of axes under twelve (12) inches in length and with a maximum head weight over two (2) pounds; and which complies with the safety standards promulgated by the World Axe Throwing League; and
- v. Premises used as an outdoor entertainment and recreation area.
- (e) *Additional exemptions*. Further, this Section shall not apply to and shall exempt from its provisions the following premises:
 - (1) Four Oaks Complex, the Memorial Auditorium, Lincoln Center, Schlanger Community Center, and the Senior Center at 3003 North Joplin Street;
 - (2) Premises which are furnished to or occupied by any state officer or employee as a residence;
 - (3) A private dining room of a hotel or motel, if the dining room is rented or made available on a special occasion only to an individual or organization for a private party and if no sale of alcoholic liquor takes place;
 - (4) Lincoln Park during the Fourth of July celebration if cereal malt beverage is sold by a licensee or permit holder who has received permission from the Governing Body to transfer such license or permit for the particular occasion; and
- (f) Additional qualified exemptions. This Section shall also not apply to and shall exempt from its provisions the following premises only between the hours of 11:00 a.m. and 9:00 p.m.:
 - (1) Premises used primarily as a pool hall; and
 - (2) A restaurant which derives less than sixty percent (60%) of its gross revenues from the bona fide sale of food for consumption on the premises.
- (g) *Underage employees and vendors allowed*. Notwithstanding any provisions of this Section, it shall not be a violation of this Section for an employee of a licensee or permit holder who is at

least 18 years of age to enter or remain on the premises, provided that the employee is under the on-premises supervision of the licensee or permit holder or an employee who is 21 years of age or older; or for an employee of a vendor to enter for the purpose of providing goods and services to the licensee or permit holder and remain only so long as to provide such goods and services.

(h) *Violations; penalty*. Violation of this Section is a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not less than \$100 and not more than \$250 or imprisonment not exceeding 30 days, or both.

Section 2. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval and publication in the official city newspaper.

ORDINANCE NO. G-1379

AN ORDINANCE amending Section 6-74 of the Pittsburg City Code to update the grounds upon which an applicant may be disqualified from receiving a cereal malt beverage license.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF PITTSBURG, KANSAS:

<u>Section 1.</u> Section 6-74 of the Pittsburg City Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 6-74. Applicant disqualification.

No license may be issued to:

- (1) A person who is not a citizen of the United States.
- (2) A person who, within two (2) years immediately preceding the date of making application, has been convicted of, released from incarceration for, or released from probation or parole for a felony or any crime involving moral turpitude, drunkenness, or driving a motor vehicle while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or the violation of any other intoxicating liquor laws of any state or of the United States.
- (3) A partnership, unless all the members of the partnership shall otherwise be qualified to obtain a license.
- (4) A corporation if any manager, officer or director thereof, or any stockholder owning in the aggregate more than twenty-five (25) percent of the stock of such corporation would be ineligible to receive a license hereunder for any reason, other than the citizenship requirements.
- (5) A corporation, if any manager, officer or director thereof, or any stockholder owning in the aggregate more than twenty-five (25) percent of the stock of such corporation, has been an officer, manager or director, or a stockholder owning in the aggregate more than twenty-five (25) percent of the stock, of a corporation which:
 - a. Has had a retailer's license revoked under K.S.A. 41-2708 and amendments thereto; or

- b. Has been convicted of a violation of the Drinking Establishment Act or the cereal malt beverage laws of this state.
- (6) A person whose place of business is conducted by a manager or agent unless such manager or agent possesses the same qualifications required of the licensee.
- (7) A person whose spouse would be ineligible to receive a retailer's license for any reason other than citizenship requirements or age, except that this subsection (7) shall not apply in determining eligibility for a renewal license.

<u>Section 2.</u> This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval and publication in the official city newspaper.

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ORDINANCE NO. G-1380

AN ORDINANCE amending Section 6-205 of the Pittsburg City Code to remove the prohibition on license issuance for non-residents of Crawford County and the State of Kansas.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF PITTSBURG, KANSAS:

<u>Section 1.</u> Section 6-205 of the Pittsburg City Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

Sec. 6-205. License; disqualification.

No license shall be issued to:

- (1) A person who is not a citizen of the United States.
- (2) A person who, within two (2) years immediately preceding the date of making application, has been convicted of, released from incarceration for, or released from probation or parole for a felony or any crime involving moral turpitude, drunkenness, driving a motor vehicle while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or the violation of any other intoxicating liquor laws of any state or of the United States.
- (3) A partnership, unless all the members of the partnership shall otherwise be qualified to obtain a license.
- (4) A corporation if any manager, officer or director thereof or any stockholder owning in the aggregate more than twenty-five (25) percent of the stock of such corporation would be ineligible to receive a license hereunder for any reason other than the citizenship requirements.
- (5) A corporation, if any manager, officer or director thereof, or any stockholder owning in the aggregate more than twenty-five (25) percent of the stock of such corporation, has been an officer, manager or director, or a stockholder owning in the aggregate more than twenty-five (25) percent of the stock, of a corporation which: (A) Has had a retailer's license revoked under K.S.A. 41-2708 and amendments thereto; or (B) has been convicted of a violation of the Drinking Establishment Act or the cereal malt beverage laws of this state.
- (6) A person whose place of business is conducted by a manager or agent unless such manager or agent possesses the same qualifications required of the licensee.

(7) A person whose spouse would be ineligible to receive a retailer's license for any reason other than citizenship requirements or age, except that this subsection (7) shall not apply in determining eligibility for a renewal license.
Section 2. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval and
